Advising at Cranwell

Cranwell International Center provides a wide range of programs and services to all undergraduate and graduate international students at Virginia Tech in Blacksburg and in the D.C. area.

International student advising and immigration services are provided by a team of International Student Advisors who are assigned a portfolio of academic college/school/department. Please note that students who visit walk-in hours are assigned to the international student advisor who is available that day, rather than their discipline-specific advisor.

Things to get ready before you arrive

- 1. Print your I-20, and sign it.
- 2. Get your visa stamp
- 3. Complete the Pre-Arrival Orientation on Canvas
- 4. Check with your airlines
- 5. Complete the immunization history form (due July 31). Check local pharmacies or providers for appointments to receive the missing immunization

When to arrive in the U.S.

All F-1 students must arrive in U.S. on or before 8/14*

When you arrive in the U.S.

- Have ready for the Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officers:
 - 1. Printed and signed I-20
 - 2. SEVIS fee receipt (I-901)
 - 3. Contact information of Cranwell International Center (phone: 540-231-6527)





Getting to D.C. campuses - Airports

- Dulles International Airport (IAD)
- Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport (DCA)
- Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI)



Getting to D.C. campuses – Ground Transportation

- Taxi/Uber
- Metrorail/metrobus



Getting to DC area – Reminders

- Allow 3-4 hours between connecting flights from your Port of Entry (the airport to which you first arrive in the US) to your next flight to allow for important immigration processing with US Customs and Border Protection (CBP).
- Bring with you cash in different notes (e.g. a couple of \$20, a few \$10 and \$5).
- Have active international plan on your phone in case there is no wifi at places.



What to do upon arrival in D.C. area campuses

- Attend International Student Orientation 8/19, registration forthcoming
- Attend College and/or Department Orientation
- Submit immigration check-in on IntlHokies
- Assistantship/on-campus positions complete I-9 paperwork and get SSN
